## Re: Win 10 MDAC problem

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If a newer version of MDAC is already installed on a system, the installer should not attempt an install over top of the existing. What appears to have happened is that Win 10 recognized that a newer version existed but was not installed, and installed the version that it already had.

I found the following on superuser.com which seems to verify that:

"You can not install MDAC on Windows 10. However, you probably dont need it. Click Start and type "ODBC" and that will bring up Setup ODBC Data Sources. There are 32 and 64 bit versions, you should probably use the 32 bit version."
